The European Hernia Society (EHS-GREPA) is a non-profit making international scientific forum that focuses on ABDOMINAL WALL SURGERY. It was founded by a group of French Surgeons in 1979 and was labeled as GREPA (Groupe de Recherche et d'Etudes de la Paroi Abdominale), but in order to adapt a more inclusive and European approach, the name was subsequently changed in 1998 to the European Hernia Society. Today the EHS-GREPA consists of 24 national chapters with more than 1100 members.

The EHS devotes itself to improving patient care by the study of both scientific and clinical related matters in the field of hernia. To this end it holds annual congresses every year, which facilitates presentations and discussions in new scientific research within hernia surgery. As a society the EHS has developed classifications and guidelines to help define surgical standards and clinical diagnosis, and also coordinates clinical trails. It is supported by "HERNIA" the official journal of the EHS as well as its sister-organization; the American Hernia Society (AHS).







Hawthorne effect


The tendency to perform or perceive differently when one knows they are being observed.



Registries are a reflection of the real world?

- Clinical-outcomes based with risk adjustment
- Peer-controlled
- Consecutive patients
- Semi-automatic process based on available administrative/billing data
- User-friendly software
- On-site monitoring and source data verification
- Possible confounders to be reported
- Multivariate analysis
- Individual surgeon anonymity guaranteed
- Continuous access to personal data & feedback with overall data

The biggest challenge is the change in mentality of the surgeon





- Excellent surgical technique
- Updated clinical decision support
- Knowing your surgical performance
- Consider asking advice/refer a patient
- Willingness to change practice

Are guidelines the best way to improve hernia surgery?

- There are many ingredients for better hernia surgery
- The very first point is good measurable quality of care, with or without following guidelines
 - Systematic registration with sound follow-up data is a must
- High quality guidelines offer a condensed critical review of the current evidence
- Dissemination is not too bad, but should be improved
